

Tour through the German Aerospace Center on Wednesday, May 11th, 2005

The German Aerospace Center (DLR) is the research center for aeronautics and space flight of Germany. Its extensive research and development work is integrated into national and international cooperative ventures. As Germany's space agency, DLR has been given responsibility for the country's space flight activities by the German federal government. DLR comprises eight sites in Köln-Porz (headquarters), Berlin, Bonn, Braunschweig, Göttingen, Lampoldshausen, Oberpfaffenhofen and Stuttgart – as well as offices in Paris, Brussels and Washington. The main emphasis in research besides aerospace is energy and transportation.

In Oberpfaffenhofen are eight institutes and facilities: the Flight Facility, the Institute of Communication and Navigation (KN), the Institute of Atmospheric Physics (IPA), the Institute of Robotics and Mechatronics, the German Remote Sensing Data Center (DFD), the Remote Sensing Technology Institute, the Microwave and Radar Institute as well as the German Space Operations Center (GSOC).



The tour will last for approximately 2 hours and will include a visit to (tentative) the German Space Operations Center, the German Remote Sensing Data Center as well as the Institute of Robotics and Mechatronics.
